

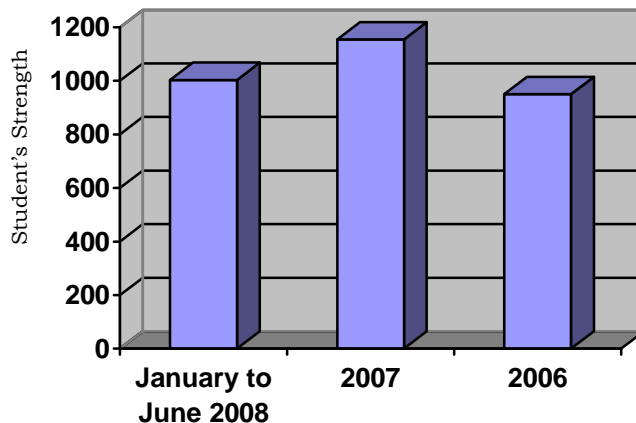
Report on BMJ Institute of Computer Sciences (BMJICS)
